2. Why do we celebrate Christmas on December 25th?


Around 350 AD, a Roman church leader named Julius the First changed a holiday that celebrated the sun on December 25th to a new holiday celebrating Jesus' birthday.


3. After learning about the Christmas tree, how will you look at it differently from now on?
